**6.5.2 The institution reviews its teaching-learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC set up as per norms and recorded the incremental improvement in various activities**

IQAC being the central body within the college monitors and review the teaching-learning process regularly. Based on feedback various innovative activities and reforms were introduced.

The improvements based on feedback implemented are:

**A) IQAC periodically reviews the teaching-learning process, structures & methodologies of operations, and learning outcomes:**

The standard methods of teaching, learning, and evaluation which are proven over the years are being followed.

**Academic Calendar:** Based on the University Academic Calendar the Institute schedules the academic calendar well in advance at the start of the year with ample time frame for not only the regular teaching-learning process but also to accommodate the various events like seminar/ guest lecture/ workshops/ FDP's/ Hands-on-series and many more.

**Preparation of lesson plan for each Semester:** The lesson plan is prepared by the faculty members for all the subjects they teach in that particular semester. Enriching the curriculum with guest lectures, industrial visits, and Internships

**Evaluation of teachers by students:** The institution has a feedback system to evaluate the teachers by students. The regular evaluation of the teachers by the students, feedback on teaching methodologies, course delivery, attitude, strengths and weaknesses, difficulties faced in the subject give a clear idea about the problems faced by the students. Director and management also monitor the feedback system and takes appropriate corrective actions.

**Student learning outcomes:** The institute monitors the performance of the students regularly. It has specified procedure to collect and analyze data on student learning outcomes; the following points are adopted by the institute in this context:

- Regular class tests and interactions.
- Midterm and continuous evaluation comprising of internal tests, assignments, group discussions, and seminar presentations.
- Semester system of examination for all courses.
- Providing Question bank of various subjects to the students.
- Providing Lecture notes.
- Timely redressal of students' grievances.
- At least 85% Attendance is compulsory in each semester.
- Extra classes for weak students to solve their problems.

**Effective internal examination and evaluation systems:** Institute maintains an effective internal examination and evaluation system.

**Students' result analysis:** Institute has the provision of analysis of students' performance after the announcement of their semester results. If the result of the students, in a subject, is not found up to the mark, necessary steps are taken to find out the reasons and the concerned faculty members are counseled and motivated to work towards improvement.

**B) Student Mentorship Scheme introduced & implemented as per Academic session**

The student Mentorship Scheme is an initiative of the institute inculcated for the overall development of the students in light of holistic improvement of knowledge enhancement and personality advancement.

**Process of Program:**

The mentor-mentee program includes three key members: the mentor an experienced faculty member, students, and a senior student member. The mentor roles are categorized clearly into two functions:

- 1) The career-related function incorporating advice to enhance the mentee's professional performance and development and,
- 2) The psychosocial function establishes the mentor as a role model and mental support system for the mentee.

In light of the effectiveness of a mentorship program, the institute management has set guidelines to include only 25 students as a mentee under the guidance of a single mentor. The students are assigned with a single mentor for clear communication between the student body and the mentor for effective development. One senior student member is also appointed based on the academic and extra-curricular performance in the past years of enrolment to provide advice and suggestions for further improvement of the student performance, thereby the performance of the institute as a whole.

Mentor-Mentee ratio introduced & implemented students were motivated and encouraged to seek guidance from the mentor. Students participated in various activities throughout the academic session. The program is conducted on a semester basis and evaluation of the performance of students is done in a two-fold manner. The performance before the engagement in the mentor-mentee program is noted in terms of communication skills, teamwork, innovative behaviour, and personal engagement. The performance evaluation on the same set of indicators is done after the successful completion of the program in 6 months (semester end). After the completion of the program students have been identified to engage in classroom participation, enhanced focus, higher well-being, and reduced absenteeism. Hence, all the teaching staff, students involved in successfully conducting the various academic and cultural event practicing decentralization and participative management.

Regular parent-teacher meeting is conducted once in a semester to enable discussion, obtaining parent feedback and taking improvement measures.

### **6.5.2. Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) and follow-up action taken: 2020-2021**

According to the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), higher education institutions provide students with an excellent education in all areas, including research, projects, internships, coursework, and employment opportunities. A well-designed system of internal and external evaluations is required to evaluate and monitor the institute's operations as part of the Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) that the NAAC expects the institutions to sign. The implementation of academic and administrative audits of colleges has become a crucial feature to support reforms of the Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) and introduce new reforms to education. An audit is the academic phrase used to describe the conclusion of a course of study. During an academic audit, the student's performance is not evaluated, and they are not given a grade.

#### **Academic Audit**

Academic audit is a methodical approach of evaluating an institution's educational quality. Its objectives include ensuring quality and enhancing the college's educational program.

#### **Administrative Audit**

Administrative auditing is the practice of carefully assessing an organization's administrative procedures in terms of their efficacy and efficiency. Building and evaluating the institutes' policies, plans, operations, and functions is the goal of the audit.

#### **Aim of Academic & Administrative Audit (AAA)**

By visiting the locations and performing a self-study on the procedures followed there, the AAA seeks to promote peer evaluations of the college from both inside and outside the organization. This aids in their ability to guarantee the standards' quality when compared to the NAAC's earlier established norms. Additionally, the institutions have the chance to recognize their deficiencies and raise the standard of instruction throughout all college systems and processes. This involves assessing all extracurricular and curricular activities and programs, which ultimately aids the institutions in upholding the high standards of education over an extended period of time.

**Institutions can conduct AAA in the following steps.**

- CO mapping, and PO Proper guidance, coaching, counselling, and mentoring programs are held in college

- Placements, internships, offered by the institute
- Soft skills, life skills, and personal grooming activities
- Social activities like waste management, gender sensitivity, and others
- Alumni programs and resource mobilization

## **2: Periodicity**

A small number of institutes conduct AAA once a year, and others do so once every three to five years. On the other hand, it is advised to conduct internal evaluations annually and consult with external peers every three to five years.

## **3: Selection of Peers/Experts For AAA**


In theory, AAA does not require any particular selection criteria. However, it is important to remember that peers should be able to demand respect from college faculty members based on their professional backgrounds, academic achievements, and industry experience.

## **4: Internal & External Approach Towards AAA**

The institution's internal quality assurance committee (IQAC) reviews the report internally, while the university or other peers may do an external review.

## **5: Peer Review**

Documents and supporting documentation for the statements made in the departmental self-study reports are included. The internal auditing team will then assess it. The internal audit team will review the report and, based on their findings, prepare a follow-up report that they will deliver to the principal of the institute. After a thorough assessment of the entire procedure by the principal, the recommendations and ideas will be implemented by the Internal Quality





Assurance Cell, or IQAC. The internal audit team's recommendations will be reviewed by the IQAC team, who will subsequently include them into the self-study report.

Following the report's revision in light of the suggestions, the external audit team is involved. To carry out the external Academic and Administrative Audits (AAA), they will step forward. In the exit meeting, they will provide a report to the principle following a comprehensive assessment of the report and discussions with the IQAC team and the principal.

The college principal receives recommendations from the external audit team, and the IQAC is tasked with putting them into practice. Subsequently, they will design a comprehensive strategy that will incorporate those recommendations in different stages throughout the organization.

Through the implementation of the IQAC team and the AAA, the educational institutions are able to consistently maintain the highest calibre of instruction. The institutes are required by the NAAC to perform the AAAs on a regular basis. The institute's staff will need to put in a lot of work in addition to creating reports, gathering evidence, enlisting the help of all departments, and planning projects. 

**Over all summary on department wise academic audit report for 2020-2021**

- As per the observation of the Audit committee, it is suggested to regularly conduct academic activities.
- Detailed tutorials and assignments, together with extra classes, are needed to provide students with a comprehensive experience in problem solving and encourage their participation in problem solving approaches.
- Suggestions like conducting study hours and special training classes have been made to strengthen PO.
- Conducting special lectures and classes as per the suggestions of the audit committee.
- The committee has further suggested that students should develop their communication skills to face the competition.
- The audit committee recommended that students increase their technical and soft skills as well as their familiarity with the newest instruments and technology. In order to address industrial demands, it has also recommended that the department host guest lectures on fostering a culture of research.
- According to the audit committee, students should take value-added courses on current advancements in pharmacy and become more conscious of sustainable growth.
- The audit committee has determined that students should be exposed to research on fundamental ideas and should be better knowledgeable about cutting-edge technologies.
- The audit committee has proposed that students be exposed to the latest technologies and industry needs more.
- Made recommendations for enhancing faculty publishing, research, and involvement in FDPs, seminars, workshops, etc.


  
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- The qualified faculty members who meet the requirements for Assistant, Associate, and Professor levels are appointed and encouraged to start research projects by registering for Ph.D. programs in every department in order to comply with the laws governing the student-teacher ratio.
- Due to the discovery that resource personnel perform a variety of training programs, seminars, conferences, and workshops, an action plan is suggested to assist the development of research for the purpose of acquiring more inventive skills.
- Students are routinely observed on a semester-by-semester basis, and the maintenance of the detention and condonation lists is based on this monitoring, which we found to be adequate to enhance the outcomes.
- Certain departments have recognized their slow learners, thus we suggested conducting extra-remedial and tutorial classes for them after confirming the supporting documentation.
- Better tools and fresh perspectives must be incorporated into the teaching-learning process. The IQAC committee's observations indicate that the use of audiovisual teaching, lectures, case studies, student engagement in the classroom, assignments, and group discussions on various topics have all been shown to be effective methods of teaching and learning. It has been discovered that all departments' best practices for giving students access to course materials are effective.
- The monitoring procedure is carried out by the principal's routine visits, CC surveillance, and the tracking of syllabus coverage through the use of track sheets. Exam cell coordinator and principal conduct routine checks on the quality of mid-exam question papers, marking of response papers, and evaluation of answer papers. So, the report has found it satisfactory.
- The industrial visit is significant in and of itself for a career. The industrial visit holds significance in a student's career as it forms a part of the college curriculum. Therefore, it is acceptable if the institution is working to advance theoretical knowledge for a prosperous professional career by combining a practical workplace viewpoint with academics.
- In order to improve results, the committee has recommended implementing a student mentorship program wherein one faculty mentor will assist each of the twenty students as they navigate both academic and personal obstacles.

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



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### **6.5.2. Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) and follow-up action taken: 2021-2022**

According to the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), higher education institutions provide students with an excellent education in all areas, including research, projects, internships, coursework, and employment opportunities. A well-designed system of internal and external evaluations is required to evaluate and monitor the institute's operations as part of the Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) that the NAAC expects the institutions to sign. The implementation of academic and administrative audits of colleges has become a crucial feature to support reforms of the Higher Education Institutes (HEIs) and introduce new reforms to education. An audit is the academic phrase used to describe the conclusion of a course of study. During an academic audit, the student's performance is not evaluated, and they are not given a grade.

#### **Academic Audit**


Academic audit is a methodical approach of evaluating an institution's educational quality. Its objectives include ensuring quality and enhancing the college's educational program.

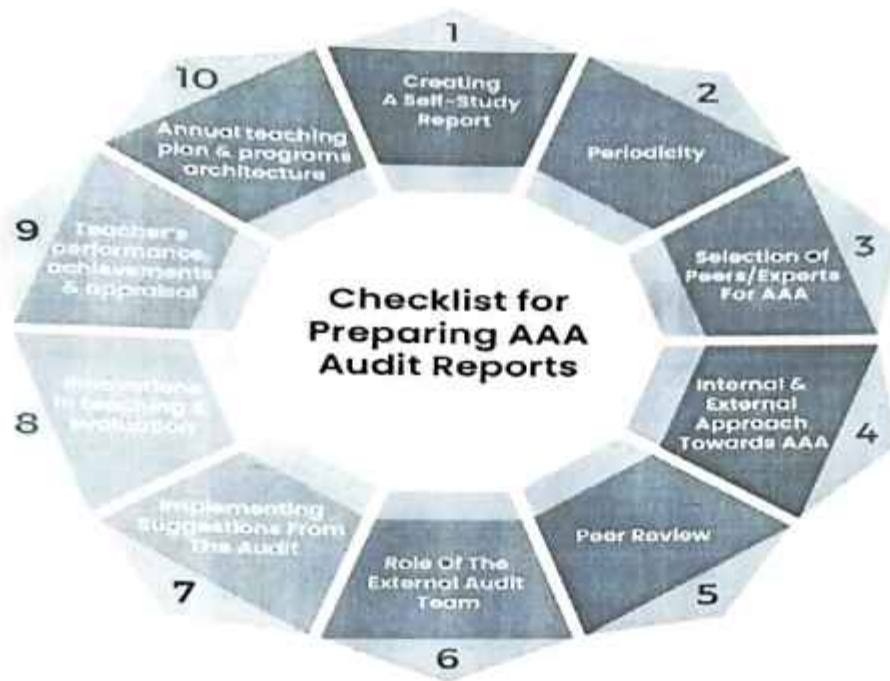
#### **Administrative Audit**

Administrative auditing is the practice of carefully assessing an organization's administrative procedures in terms of their efficacy and efficiency. Building and evaluating the institutes' policies, plans, operations, and functions is the goal of the audit.

#### **Aim of Academic & Administrative Audit (AAA)**

By visiting the locations and performing a self-study on the procedures followed there, the AAA seeks to promote peer evaluations of the college from both inside and outside the organization. This aids in their ability to guarantee the standards' quality when compared to the NAAC's earlier established norms. Additionally, the institutions have the chance to recognize their deficiencies and raise the standard of instruction throughout all college systems and processes. This involves assessing all extracurricular and curricular activities and programs, which ultimately aids the institutions in upholding the high standards of education over an extended period of time.

  
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**Institutions can conduct AAA in the following steps.**

### **#1: Creating a Self-Study Report**

The institute's departments each prepare a self-study report that covers one of the seven NAAC criterion points for their individual departments. Additionally, all departmental operations and procedures, as well as the supporting documentation, must be included in this. A couple of the points that should be heavily stressed in the report are listed below.

- Innovations in various systems like teaching, exams, and evaluation
- Documentation of daily activities and performance of the faculty members
- Major emphasis on course and teaching plans as well as program architecture that is prepared annually
- Implementation of strategies to encourage Outcome-Based Education (OBE)/PSO,

  
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- CO mapping, and PO Proper guidance, coaching, counselling, and mentoring programs are held in college
- Research activities, projects, publications, and consultancy programs are held in the institute
- Workshops and conferences held
- Startups or any entrepreneurial activities by students
- Teacher's performance along with their professional and personal achievements
- Placements, internships, offered by the institute
- Soft skills, life skills, and personal grooming activities
- Social activities like waste management, gender sensitivity, and others
- Alumni programs and resource mobilization

## **#2: Periodicity**

A small number of institutes conduct AAA once a year, and others do so once every three to five years. On the other hand, it is advised to conduct internal evaluations annually and consult with external peers every three to five years.

## **#3: Selection Of Peers/Experts For AAA**

In theory, AAA does not require any particular selection criteria. However, it is important to remember that peers should be able to demand respect from college faculty members based on their professional backgrounds, academic achievements, and industry experience.

## **#4: Internal & External Approach Towards AAA**

The institution's internal quality assurance committee (IQAC) reviews the report internally, while the university or other peers may do an external review.

## **#5: Peer Review**

Documents and supporting documentation for the statements made in the departmental self-study reports are included. The internal auditing team will then assess it. The internal audit team will review the report and, based on their findings, prepare a follow-up report that they will deliver to the principal of the institute. After a thorough assessment of the entire procedure by the principal, the recommendations and ideas will be implemented by the Internal Quality

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Assurance Cell, or IQAC. The internal audit team's recommendations will be reviewed by the IQAC team, who will subsequently include them into the self-study report.

**#6: Role of the External Audit Team**

**#7: Implementing Suggestions from the Audit**

Following the report's revision in light of the suggestions, the external audit team is involved. To carry out the external Academic and Administrative Audits (AAA), they will step forward. They have a scheduled visitation and will carry out the audit in accordance with it when they visit the institute. In the exit meeting, they will provide a report to the principle following a comprehensive assessment of the report and discussions with the IQAC team and the principal.

The college principal receives recommendations from the external audit team, and the IQAC is tasked with putting them into practice. Subsequently, they will design a comprehensive strategy that will incorporate those recommendations in different stages throughout the organization.

Through the implementation of the IQAC team and the AAA, the educational institutions are able to consistently maintain the highest calibre of instruction. The institutes are required by the NAAC to perform the AAAs on a regular basis. The institute's staff will need to put in a lot of work in addition to creating reports, gathering evidence, enlisting the help of all departments, and planning projects. - Made recommendations for enhancing faculty publishing, research, and involvement in FDPs, seminars, workshops, etc.



- The qualified faculty members who meet the requirements for Assistant, Associate, and Professor levels are appointed and encouraged to start research projects by registering for Ph.D. programs in every department in order to comply with the laws governing the student-teacher ratio.
- Due to the discovery that resource personnel perform a variety of training programs, seminars, conferences, and workshops, an action plan is suggested to assist the development of research for the purpose of acquiring more inventive skills.

It has been discovered that all departments' best practices for giving students access to course materials are effective.
- The monitoring procedure is carried out by the principal's routine visits, CC surveillance, and the tracking of syllabus coverage through the use of track sheets. Exam cell coordinator and principal conduct routine checks on the quality of mid-exam question papers, marking of response papers, and evaluation of answer papers. So, the report has found it satisfactory.
- The industrial visit is significant in and of itself for a career. The industrial visit holds significance in a student's career as it forms a part of the college curriculum. Therefore, it is acceptable if the institution is working to advance theoretical knowledge for a prosperous professional career by combining a practical workplace viewpoint with academics.
- In order to improve results, the committee has recommended implementing a student mentorship program wherein one faculty mentor will assist each of the twenty students as they navigate both academic and personal obstacles.



#### **Academic Audit**


Academic audit is a methodical approach of evaluating an institution's educational quality. Its objectives include ensuring quality and enhancing the college's educational program.
